

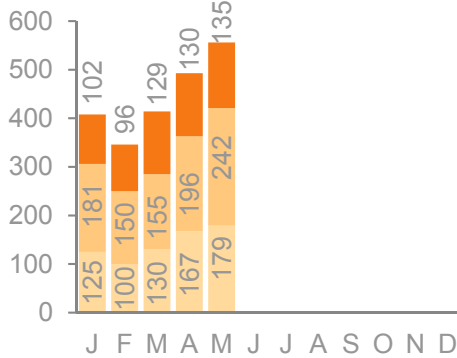

2016 CALL VOLUME

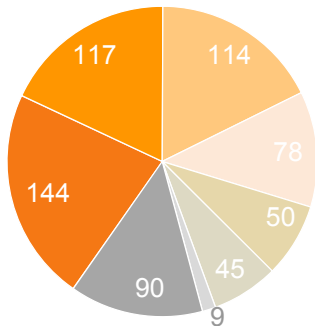
In May we experienced a total housing related call volume of **556**.

PRESENTING NEEDS

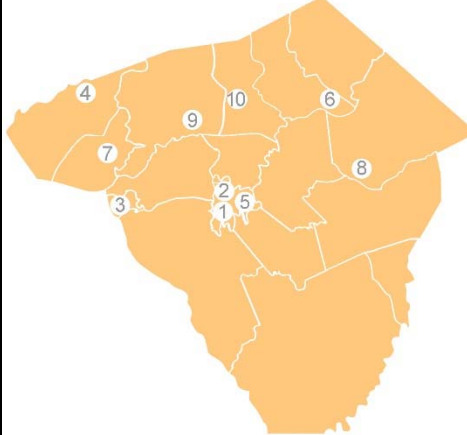
Some callers have multiple housing concerns. Captured are the total housing needs requested.

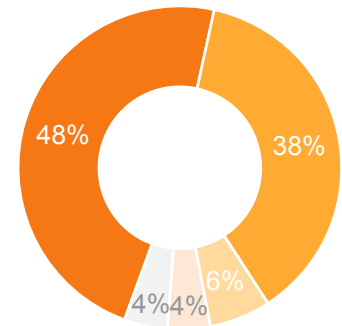
